- data lock date
- report run date
- total reports (not total reactions)”*

MHRA Response

We confirm that we hold the information you have requested.

Gardasil 9 was introduced into the HPV immunisation programme in July 2019 and is now the only HPV vaccine supplied for the national programme.

In response to your request I can confirm that the VAP provided in the response to FOI2024/00466 had a data lock date of 3rd September 2024 and a report run date of 4th September 2024. As of the 4th September 2024 the MHRA had received a total of 444 UK spontaneous ADR reports for Gardasil 9 and the earliest reported reaction date was 01/01/2014.

The MHRA continuously monitors the safety of vaccines through a variety of pharmacovigilance processes, including the Yellow Card scheme. As part of our signal detection processes, all adverse reaction reports received by the Yellow Card scheme are assessed, and cumulative information is reviewed at regular intervals. If appropriate, regulatory action would be taken if any serious risks were confirmed.
