*Can you please advise how many customer emails/letters have been received per annum since the Finasteride drugs launch for male pattern baldness.
If possible, please include emails/letters from medical professionals and detail them separately.*

MHRA Response

We can confirm that we hold the information you have requested. Letters received by the MHRA are scanned and then shared with the appropriate team via email for a response to be drafted, where required, followed by disposal of original copies therefore we are unable to search our records for the number of letters received regarding finasteride.

We have searched our records for all emails containing the word “finasteride” and the results are detailed in the table below, split by emails received from the general public and healthcare professionals (HCPs):
